WHEN: Wednesdays bi-weekly, beginning September 20th.

Weekly Schedule

12:30 – 1:30	Sharing and Speaking <i>Reading buddies: (30 mins)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Older children & younger children will be paired to practice reading with each other.- <i>Goal: develop reading skills, cultivate responsibility and caring, build relationships</i> <i>Sharing/ Speaking: (30 mins)</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Students have the opportunity to share with each other in a public setting. They may present something they have been learning or working on at home (ie; poster projects, dioramas, scripture memory, book report, story writing), or opt to bring something for “show-and-tell”.- Dates to be set aside for speeches and science fair for the older grades- It is not necessary for every child to present each week; however all those who wish to share will have the chance (children can be divided into groups based on time limitations).- <i>Goal: build public speaking, idea-sharing, and listening skills</i>
1:30 - 2:30	STEM and Arts <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Each week will have a different point of focus such as: outdoor education, creating and presenting group skits, Christmas art projects/ baking- Life skill workshops such as woodworking, sewing, cooking, CPR training, etc. may be offered based on help and resources available (if parents are interested in spearheading something specific, let’s chat!)- <i>Goal: to provide a group setting for learning about science and arts which may be difficult to create at home</i>
2:30 - 3:30	Play/ Free time <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Recess! Children are free to play with their peers outside or inside- <i>Goal: cultivate relationships within the church family, and allow time to play and grow with peers.</i>
